Boundary changes are looming yet again, with part smothered cries of gerrymandering! Dorset North is the main casualty in these proposals as it is expected to be one of two SW constituencies to be scrapped altogether! Current proposals will split it into two and amalgamate the northern section with part of Wiltshire and the southern with Mid-Dorset and North Poole. Please see the accompanying supplement to see where you might well end up. If you wish to make comments [polite of course!] to the Boundary Commission the consultation period runs from 13th September to 5th December 2011. You can either write to them [their preferred method], email or phone them or attend a special Public Hearing in Bournemouth, the only one in Dorset. Jeremy Nieboer - A step back for reflection.

Now that all we have forecast and feared has come to pass in the Eurozone we should pause and reflect on this watershed in our political and economic life. As the keen realities of being trapped in the folly of the single currency begin to emerge from the mists of delusion and mendacity that has attended the entire project 2 facts stand out.

The first is that our entire political elite has betrayed its electorate. In the remorseless accretion of power by the EU regime the Conservative, Labour and Liberal Democrat parties have willingly abandoned the sovereignty which had been assured for us by the sacrifice and wisdom of our forbears. Never – not even in the shameful days of appeasement from 1933 – 1938 - has there been such an abject betrayal of what was the envy of the world - our freedom, independence and parliamentary sovereignty.

The second is that the Conservative party bears the greater guilt. By deceit we were induced to submit to what it is, a Politburo. At each stage of our shameful surrender – the Accession, Single European Act, Maastricht, Nice and Amsterdam it was the Conservatives that led us into this pass and denied us any voice. The so called Eurosceptics, with few honourable exceptions, are most to blame since they promised the unattainable – reform of the EU and its institutions – an illusion which they have fostered knowing it to be such.

We can be quietly proud that we took the steep and rugged pathway.

Two EU dictats appear to continue the theme of restricting the movement of the peoples of the EU, especially the British, on top of the rail fare increases discussed in last month's newsletter. The first EU proposal if adopted will take many **motorcyclists** off the road. Bikes over 7 years old may be banned from cities; sleeved dayglow jackets may become compulsory; non standard bikes and self servicing may become illegal, and computerised chips may monitor and eventually disable the machines, with stiffer emission laws also being enforced. The whole package will make motorcycling much more expensive, more inconvenient, and a less widely used mode of transport.

The second, a harsh new and grossly unfair interpretation of EU rules starting in October mean that up to one million people with **diabetes** could lose their driving licences. DVLA now classifies them as unfit to drive. Experts claim the 'unnecessarily strict' changes will affect hundreds of thousands who have been driving for decades without problems. They say the rules amount to a blanket ban on diabetics taking insulin who occasionally have 'hypos' – episodes of hypoglycaemia, or low blood sugar, which may cause blackouts if not countered with a sugary snack. A diabetic who has two hypos in a year – even while in bed – will end up banned from driving. The charity Diabetes UK has protested to the Department for Transport about the changes, saying that such drivers are safe and not proven to be otherwise.

The Campaign for Real **Recycling** won the right to a judicial review of the Government's compliance with a revised EU Waste Framework Directive. Depending on the result, the sorting of collected recyclable waste will no longer be done at a depot but will require pre-sorting in up to 9 bins by each householder. This will cost millions to implement and create more journey-miles for the local authorities who are charged with the collection.

A wind farm has been paid £1.2 million not to produce **electricity** for eight-and-a-half hours. This will go to a Norwegian company which owns 60 turbines in the Scottish Borders. The National Grid asked the company, Fred Olsen Renewables, to shut down its Crystal Rig II wind farm for a little over eight hours amid fears the electricity network would become overloaded. The problem was caused by high winds buffeting the country in the wake of Hurricane Katia. This mind numbing sum is 10 times more than the value of the unproduced electricity. If you think this is a one-off, another 10 sites shutdown in the same week receiving a total of £1.4m. What a farce wind power is!

"What the media is saying":

- A spokesman at the Department for Business (BIS) told the *Telegraph* that the new agency workers legislation, which entitles temps to the same pay and benefits as permanent staff after just 12 weeks in a job, will definitely come into force unchanged from when it was laid before Parliament last year. [Just like all EU legislation – Ed]
- Amazingly, the *BBC* has reported that MPs have said that a project to set up nine regional control centres [from 46 local ones] for fire & rescue services in England was a "complete failure" & wasted £469m. The plan was axed last December.
- *Confused.com* informs us that the government is considering changing our safe MOT system to the European model [& Directive], where a car has its first MOT when it is four years old and then every two years thereafter.
- Sex-free British passports could be brought in to allow transgender people to opt out of identifying themselves as either male or female under plans being considered by the Home Office, despite security concerns, reports *MSN.com*.
- **Mark Staplehurst and Steve Smith, who represent the West Heath ward in Farnborough, have resigned from the Conservative party, and joined UKIP after attending recent UKIP party conference, *Gethampshire.com* has reported.**

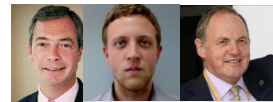

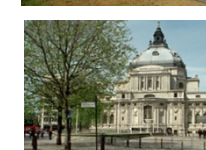

Special October Supplement

The Boundary Commission for England has produced initial proposals for their 5 year review of Parliamentary constituency boundaries.

Their aim is to reduce the number of MPs in Westminster to 600, a reduction of 50. England will lose 31 seats making a total of 502. Each new seat will be between 72,810 and 80,473 electors which is within 5% of the ideal 76,641.

The South West will lose 2 seats making a new total of 53 seats.

Dorset will combine with Wiltshire to make a sub-region of 1 million electorate and be represented by 14 MPs, a reduction of 1 over current numbers. Only North Swindon, South Swindon, South Dorset & West Dorset remain the same.

Poole will gain Broadstone; Bournemouth West gains Branksome West and Newton; Bournemouth East gains Winton East; Christchurch gains Verwood and Alderholt but suffers the loss of Stapehill and West Parley; Mid-Dorset and North Poole is to be renamed Blandford and Wimborne, incorporating Christchurch's losses and covering Bere Regis, Wareham, Wimborne Minster and Blandford Forum and surrounding area; the remainder of Dorset North will join with Warminster and Westbury in a new constituency called Warminster and Shaftesbury.

It is expected that local councils of all levels will be unaffected by these changes as many already bridge two constituencies.
