Dorset is celebrating that it has another UKIP **Town Councillor**, indeed our 7<sup>th</sup>. Keen gardener **Lynda Ovens** has been elected unopposed for the Longham ward of Ferndown Town Council. She joins Peter Lucas in representing Longham, and John Baxter and Nick Wellstead in representing UKIP in this council. Our congratulations go to Lynda for her perseverance and determination as this application has rather dragged on, and we are sure she will work well for her ward. We have now a presence of 4 councillors on this council. Today Ferndown Council, Tomorrow the Country!



We are delighted that **Linda Dixon** volunteered for the Shaftesbury ward in the forthcoming **County Council elections** in May. We also need others to follow Linda's lead and fill the remaining **vacancies** in Dorset North. We have vacancies in: Blackmore Vale [a provisional candidate in hand]; Blandford; Cranborne Chase; Gillingham; Hambledon; Stour Vale; Winterborne and two in Verwood. How many can we fill these with serious or paper candidates? Hands up to John Baxter please, pretty please & pretty quick!

Dorset West and Dorset South, including Weymouth and Portland, also need more candidates and when we last heard one more is needed in Poole's Colehill, with Christchurch needing one in Ferndown. If you can help with these, even as a paper candidate [i.e. someone who does not actively canvas support] let your chairman know now. Time is short.

In January we heard the great earth-shattering **speech** from the PM on the EU. All we learned is that he fully deserves Peter Hitchens' designation of Mr Slippery! All smoke and mirrors. Plan A: He promises to renegotiate with the EU, but not until he is re-elected. Then after 3 years if undefined but adequate powers are repatriated he will hold an in/out referendum, whilst campaigning to remain in the EU. So at best 5 years of continuing and increasing payments to the EU, including more EU bank propping up and stacks of foreign aid dished out, and even more legislation and power grabbing which are not in the British interest. As usual he is safe. He is unlikely to be re-elected in 2015, his party is split on the subject. Labour is strengthening all the time thanks in part to East European immigrants moving to the UK with UK voting rights. These two points mean he will not have to renegotiate or hold a referendum. Plan B? On the unlikely event of his re-election the EU and big business will pump massive funds into the 'IN' campaign, with most of the media on their side, totally drowning out the 'OUT' cry. More unlikely is Plan C, when Merkel allows a miniscule and temporary return of some insignificant powers [as was done in 1975 to successfully sweeten the referendum voters] and the criteria is met – no need of a referendum. Nowhere does he say we will have a referendum if he wins no concessions, as surely he won't as the EU continues to refuse all repatriation of powers [see the first 'link' below]. UKIP MEP Godfrey Bloom says Britain should not allow the 26 police forces across the EU access to the personal details of **British motorists**. "Brussels may well be threatening to levy fines totalling millions of pounds if we don't do as they instruct but we must stand firm and refuse to be bullied. Handing over the DVLA database containing details of 38 million drivers is a recipe for disaster. Not all these countries have such high police standards as the UK and it is not difficult to foresee incorrect details being input into computer systems. Innocent motorists could then have enormous trouble proving their innocence." This clearly has implications in respect to the European Arrest Warrant.



## Jeremy Nieboer continues his articles about the Lies about leaving the EU: (3) Loss of EU exports cannot be made up in Global trade.



We do not need to be a member of the EU to trade with its member states.

45% of our total trade is with the EU26, adjusting for exports via Rotterdam and Antwerp whose destination or ownership is outside the EU<sup>1</sup>. But our trade with the EU26 is far less than the 2 strongest European economies. 80% of Norway's and 60% of Switzerland's total exports are with the Euro area<sup>2</sup>. Yet they are not in the EU. Nor is the expanding export trade of China with the EU26 inhibited by not being in the EU and subject to its regulatory regime. The USA exports more to the EU than the UK without being governed by it.

The EU itself has free trade agreements with non-EU countries including Israel, Mexico, Switzerland, Turkey and Norway. With a positive trading balance with Britain of £28bn<sup>3</sup> and over 6m EU jobs depending on it<sup>4</sup> is it surely inconceivable that the EU would imperil such trade by refusing us a workable free trade agreement.

Can we be confident that our global trade will improve if we leave the EU?

The EU is a customs union not a free trade area. It distorts free trade by its tariffs on non EU imports and by the CAP. It also applies direct protectionism as with the quotas on sugar cane which are putting hundreds of jobs at risk at Tate & Lyle<sup>5</sup>. The most authoritative studies show that the liberalisation of trade by leaving the EU will increase UK GDP by 3%<sup>6</sup> or £45bn each year<sup>7</sup>. Whilst we cannot assume that all our trade would be entirely free the benefits would be substantial.

We joined the Common Market at a time of high world tariffs. Lower trade barriers were then a distinct benefit. But that is no longer so. GATT has reduced tariffs on industrial goods from over 20% to well under 5% and services are now included. Governments of great economic areas, including China, India and Brazil – once closed to our exports - have now embraced free trade as a generator of prosperity.

Leaving the EU will mean that we will again have our own voice in the WTO and be free to negotiate free trade deals.

The EU prohibits Britain entering into free trade agreements with other countries. Yet even so we had a 2011 surplus on overall current account with non-EU countries of £17bn<sup>8</sup> against a deficit of £46bn with the EU27. Our trade with the rest of the world has grown by over 12% since 2000. Our most successful trade is with the USA (surplus £22bn) but Australasia (£9.8bn), Switzerland (£8.5bn), Singapore (£4.3bn), Brazil (£2.4bn), and South Africa (£2.1bn) contribute heavily. We are a great trading nation ranking 5th in the world<sup>9</sup> with unique historic global reach. Such are the facts.

All this signifies a far better future for Britain as a trading nation out of the EU.

## What the media is saying:

The *EUobserver* states that Germany and France will table joint proposals for deeper eurozone integration by May and are "working closely" to get a deal on the EU's seven-year budget in February.

Also according to the *EUobserver* a European tax on financial transactions has moved a step closer to reality after EU finance ministers gave the go-ahead for 11 countries to put it into law.

Peter Hitchens writes in the *Mail on Sunday*: "May I volunteer to teach BBC staff our lovely, customary English measures, which they seem so keen to abandon but which are now to be brought back into schools? The poor things are floundering with the foreign metric system, recently claiming that some cliffs in the Falklands (actually 600 feet high) towered to a height of '2,000 metres'. This is because metric measurements are inhuman, and hard to memorise or imagine."

*Reuters* reports that EU Internal Market Commissioner Michel Barnier said recently that France should hold a national debate on what it wants from the EU, noting, "60% of rules, norms and laws in France are derived from European legislation. How can we accept never to discuss these policies except to say it's all Brussels' fault?" [Only 60%? A 2 speed EU? Some say it is 83% in the UK. Ed]
