



The biggest event of September has to have been the UKIP's 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Annual Conference held in the Methodist Central Hall in Westminster. Around 1,300 Delegates, a record attendance, heard from a great variety of speakers on an equally varied range of subjects. We will attempt to give you a basic report but we do advise that you find a way to watch the online key speeches. <http://www.ukip.org/conferencelive> is where many are to be found. Reporting on the conference this year seemed for the most part focused upon the departure of a UKIP MEP after some injudicious remarks and actions. However most attending the full conference felt that that occurred for the most part on Friday and should left there! So that is what we shall do.



**David Coburn** and **Jeffery Titford** got the show on the road. David spoke of the excellent results achieved in London election, the highest achieving 39%. Jeffery told us we are heading for a supra-national state, achieved by appalling government and a weak PM who was tied to the wishes of the opposition. Everything they touch is made worse,

as is the case with HS2 and windfarms. MEP **Timo Soini** of the Finns Party said all had been told we can't leave the EU without our individual countries dying, and that the EU in charge of things was like 'Ronny Biggs driving a security van for the Bank of England!' **Slavi Binev** MEP founder of the 'People for Real, Open and United Democracy' party in Bulgaria, a member of the EFD group, wants Bulgarians to return home, and the EU to realise it has lost its way and that with policies one size does not fit all.



**Roger Helmer** UKIP MEP spoke at length on energy issues. He pointed out fracking has been going on for 50 years, without damaging the water table as it is situated 10x lower than the water table. Worldwide fracking wells number 2 million without any pollution. UKIP would set up a Sovereign Wealth Fund from the profits of Shale Gas. There are 6 million in fuel poverty in this country, a situation set to worsen by playground technologies such as wind and other renewable power sources.

**Mark Littlewood**, Director General of the Institute of Economic Affairs, had attended the LibDem conference and found it to be a depressing experience! UKIP policies were right for the country, although we would have an awful lot to do to clear up the inherited mess. Facts include £80m being spent by government every hour; this was 50% of GDP against 20% of most countries and Russia's 17%; Welfare would cost £220bn a year by 2014, £10k per home. N. I. should be scrapped as it's just a tax; and the cost of living cut by reforms to agriculture, planning, tax system & energy policies.



**Paul Nuttall** MEP, Party Deputy Leader, claimed Labour voters were most affected by EU policies. UKIP was now 2<sup>nd</sup> in the N.E. - therefore the opposition. Labour did not represent the working people – how many of their politicians were members of working men's clubs? Their immigration policy was a disgrace, and the Human Rights Act was truly a criminal's charter. The country needed UKIP's commonsense policies, neither left or right wing, including an Australian style immigration policy; prison sentences being what they are meant to be [life = life]; defence cuts reversed; and implementation of a fair taxation system taking those on minimum wage out of direct taxation. Later he spoke on education pointing out that only 5 students achieved an Ox-Bridge place this year from North Liverpool. The 50% rule should be reduced considerably, with students being there on merit and taking proper courses. More technology based courses should be made available elsewhere. The current model produces graduates without hope of employment.



**Nigel Farage's** main speech, one of only two made recently that were scripted for distribution reasons, and one of three he made to this conference, was his usual stirring stuff but has been widely reported upon elsewhere and shown live on TV so we shall not cover it here. Suffice it to say he achieved a massive ovation before and after!



**Professor Tim Congden** has produced an update version of his fact filled 'How much does the EU cost Britain?'



which is essential reading. His slide presentation listed the various costs we face in the EU: Direct fiscal; of regulation; of resource misallocation; of lost jobs; and miscellaneous insults such as ECJ fines and benefit tourism. Since Labour opened the UK up to uncontrolled immigration in 2004 the number of jobs taken by foreign born immigrants has risen by 1.8m and the number of jobs held by the UK-born has fallen by 400,000.

**Patrick O'Flynn**, political editor of the Daily Express and UKIP MEP candidate, and seen since giving an excellent performance of 'Question Time', pointed out that membership of the LibDems has fallen from 70k to 40k, and the Tories 240K down to 134k, with UKIP now up to 30k [ed. Now 31K!]. If trends continue UKIP membership would exceed that of the Lib Dems by next year! Top captains of industry, some of the highest paid in the world, have cosy arrangements with the EU including Tariff prices and cheap immigrant labour, thus are all for it. Yet just 9% of our exports go to the EU. The EU is the sick man of the world.



**Tim Aker**, formally of the TPA, is now Head of Policy for UKIP. Regarding immigrants, he believes they should contribute for several years before they can claim welfare, the National Health Service is not the International Health Service – they should have private health care arranged prior to coming to this country. They should also be able to fund themselves and their dependents for 5 years. It is madness that with 1 million of our young unemployed the EU is advertising 800,000 EU [and Africa, Ed.] wide and yet France is similarly just 14,000 positions. Our youths are not workshy, and would benefit from Work sharing and local training. If on benefit and you are offered a job you take it! There should be no cases such as the unemployed Latvian woman receiving £34K and a big house at our expense. Future family benefits should be capped at 2 children. Pension should not be interfered with by government and should first be simplified.



**Gerard Batten** MEP would rename the 'Police Service' the 'Police Force' and include the Crown Prosecution Service [Criminal Protection Service!]. Sentences should be what they say, although a 10% for good behaviour may be fair. The Police should do what they are there to do, with court punishing properly, with no privatisation of the Police or Prison service. Eu Arrest Warrants [EAW] are a gross injustice and should be banned. Teresa May signed the EU Evidence Warrant [EEW] without any opt out. Great capital is being made of the 135 matters for opt out by this government and 'just 35' being re-opted in including the EAW, EEW, immigration and asylum law. The 100 are meaningless and mostly superseded, thus there is no gain from this – just a confidence trick. All are an almost complete transfer of power to the EU.



To illustrate the iniquity of the EAW we heard the moving personal experiences from **Deborah Dark**. Cleared in France over 6 years ago of a drug offence due to mistaken identity, she was arrested at a Turkish airport in 2007 despite there being no warrants outstanding or any convictions. Eventually released she went to S. Africa and on her return in 2008 to Spain she was rearrested. Having collapsed at the airport and been sedated she was held in high security for a month before being returned to Gatwick where she was rearrested and taken to Holloway. Eventually she was granted bail of £5k. Amazingly the EAW was still in place as no one knew how to cancel it. Fortunately after years of fighting and worry the French have dropped the case and rescinded the EAW. Six years of her life totally ruined, plus untold damage.



**Suzanne Fernandes**, a youth mentor to young offenders, claimed that youth crime was a way of life for some. Crime was a badge of honour. Yet offending immigrants are rarely deported, and that Feltham is as soft as a holiday camp. Prisoners should work for privileges, and we should be active against gangs in prisons. We are seeing the results of privatisation.



Despite his impending departure **Godfrey Bloom** MEP spoke at length and sensibly on defence. The Defence of the Realm should be the government's no1 priority and that UKIP has more expertise on this subject than all the other parties together. It was right to oppose attacks on Syria and Iraq – Defence not attack. 'We are not an international police force.' The outmoded and bloated 60K staffed MoD should be abolished in favour of a 3K strong procurement organisation buying sensibly priced and suitably equipped kit at far smaller costs than at present. He highlighted Israel's Apache helicopters costing £12m each against MoD sourced ones at £60m. Moral contracts should be made with our soldiers, sailors and aircraft staff. Political photo shoots at the front line should also be halted.





Education was **Roger Bird's** topic. The SE UKIP Chairman criticised the LibDem's plans for government funded school meals for all – a waste of £600m a year as many parents could afford to cover this cost. Primary Schools are now under extreme pressure due to immigration. We should encourage faith schools, and increase Grammar schools from their present 164 countrywide. Selection is necessary due to overcrowding, rewarding merit not parents' house buying prowess.

**Steve Maine** spoke on business matters. The use of dodgy data, such as the 3 million jobs would be lost if we exited the EU, would explain the CBI voting 80% to remain in the EU. He quoted Lord Lawson stating that Cameron's renegotiation with the EU would produce infinitesimal benefits, something echoed by Boris Johnson. We should counter the dodgy data at all opportunities.



**Lord Digby Jones**, the business guru and former Labour minster [incidentally he never has voted



Labour, Tory, or Lib-Dem – UKIP was not mentioned in the list!], reminded us that the public sector could not exist without the business sector. 20% of world food is produced in Brazil, although this century will belong to China. A baby born today has 33% of being alive in 100 years. He compared the EU to a group of nations marching valiantly towards 1970! He asked what future a country has that puts into prison anyone who works more than 48 hours a week?

An urgent referendum is needed, and if we get out of the EU we should join EFTA within 24 hours. The EUP election is a big wake up call.

The very full first day ended with a Q& A session with the panel being **Nigel Farage, Steve Crowther, Lisa Duffy, Tim Aker** and **Paul Nuttall**. Topics included whether leaving the EU could be an amicable divorce; Should there be an English parliament; and looking after returning soldiers [part of UKIP policies].

Saturday was a different format with motions, medals and more speakers. Party Treasurer **Stewart Wheeler** was



delighted membership was increasing but pleaded for more funds, including legacies in wills. He cited that the May 2013 elections cost £80k, with an additional £200K spent on advertising; UKIP's running costs are £80K a month with £80K being spent on each parliamentary by-election. It was estimated that the local and EUP elections in May 2014 would cost the party £4m, money that we do not yet have! As a result UKIP has employed a fund raising company [vetted by S.W. himself] and that he personally would be seeing potential big donors. This would not be enough and he suggested that all members should recruit at least one member each by Christmas; Donate when renewing subscriptions; leave a legacy; and text 78866 at conference to donate £5!

**Mark Harland** stated that the Sovereign draw was now achieving a steadily increasing 4,000 players a month, with 2 sovereigns a month being won. [23 winners so far]. Please consider entering even if only £1 a week.

**Peter Whittle**, founder of the New Culture Forum, suggested our way of life is uncomfortable and embarrassed.



Our leaders are full of guilt for the past, our history of shame, and have a self-loathing of our country. Even Sharia is acceptable to the ex-Archbishop of Canterbury. Our aims should include a National unity and integration, immigrants to accept our traditions and way of life. We should freeze immigration until we have fixed things. We should 'do flags' in our schools, universities and public buildings and more national occasions such as an annual Festival of Britain. All should be taught the

English language and official forms should cease to be multilingual. Our birthright of freedom of speech is non-negotiable. There should be zero tolerance of forced marriages, genital mutilation, honour killings and Sharia Law, the latter not being inevitable. The Rule of Law to be British Law.

**Angus Dalglish**, Prof. of Oncology at St George's Hospital, spoke on the EU threat to the NHS. With massive



and increasing demands upon its services the EU has limited the hours staff can work resulting in 3x the nurses etc needed overnight to provide a safe service; the training of specialists has been decimated with the newly qualified lacking in the necessary skills. The Eu's Freedom of movement has put vast strains for cancer treatment [costing 60-80K a year per patient], thus the UKIP policy

[Photo © Bionorpharma.com] of getting immigrants to pay for private health care is essential. Labour implemented the Private Finance Initiatives has indebted the country massively and increased costs 6 fold rather than simply borrowing at market rates, as well as reducing the number of NHS hospitals by half over 20yrs. The Professor mentioned many more salient points that regretfully we have no space to report.

UKIP's spokesman on small businesses is **Amjad Bashir**, a proud Yorkshire man since the age of 11! "I wasn't



born in Yorkshire but came as soon as I could!" His family had always worked hard in business without ever accepting state handouts. He claimed the EU had brought the UK to its knees, the principle that hard work pays is lost in an abyss. Immigration is not a race issue – just simple economics. In 1971 4% of the population was born overseas, in 2011 this has risen to 12%, with 25% of family births emanating from them. UK Benefits are now even available to those who have

never even set foot in the UK and health tourism is now widespread. Three kinds of immigration exist: those who would work hard; those in true peril; and non-contributing takers. The first two should be allowed in small numbers, but none of the third should be permitted. Action taken should include the creation of an Immigration Minister and effective border controls, implementing British policies. Clamp down on bogus colleges and visa expiration making rule breaking a criminal offence, removing the offenders. Scrap the EU Human Rights Act!

In a section dedicated to the first 20yrs of UKIP **John Whittaker** charted UKIP's growth, now with MEPs, three Lords in the Upper House and numerous councillors. The South West's **Bob Smith** claimed that Newlyn's fishing had been wiped out by EU policy. He spoke forcefully that the press were out to destroy UKIP and that all should be on their guard against it. Racism could destroy us as the press won't let the subject drop. We should stand up for what we believe. **Nigel Farage** added that he remembered two early meetings arranged by the late Malcolm Wood & himself in Hanging Landford in Wiltshire that no one attended!

**John Harvey** reminded us that Maggie Thatcher was removed for being anti-Eu – and that none of her successors were up to the job. UK infrastructure is cracking – in 1800 our population was 9m, today it is over 64m. UKIP stands for the working people and will give government back to the British.

**Andrew Charalambous** spoke on the pressure on housing, that with 4m immigrants over the last 10 years and the Lib-Dems wish for millions more homes. Immigration had to be curtailed to sort the problem.

**Neil Hamilton**, Deputy Party Chairman, discussed the EUP elections next year and 2014 local elections were addressed by **Cllr Peter Reeve** and **Cllr Mo Elenor**. **Cllr Chris Adams** spoke on the unnecessary EU vanity project of the HS2. **David Coburn** returned to the platform to discuss the Scottish Referendum which was clearly not in Scotland's best interests.

There were then many more speakers and motions that we simply have no room to lay before you here. We will briefly mention the medals awarded to stalwart members who have 20 years of membership. These included party notables such as David Lott, John Whittaker, Jeffery Titford and one Nigel Farage. More locally these included John Harvey of Salisbury, Bob Smith of Cornwall and Peter West and Dave Parker also from the South West. Due



to a reorganisation of the timetable and the Bournemouth coach leaving by 6pm a number were unable to receive their medals on stage. One is local to us. We are pleased to congratulate **David Cox** [left] of Bournemouth East UKIP for being included in this number. 20 years of valuable service to his country and party. We salute them all.

It should be remarked upon that the first four sessions of the conference was each chaired very confidently by a different lady chairman. **Janice Atkinson** opened the proceedings and **Margot Parker** and **Louise Bours** presided during the rest of the day. The last was **Diane James** who covered the morning of day two with **Lisa Duffy** chairing the campaigns section. The pattern was shattered by Steve Crowther, Nigel Farage and Derek Clarke!

After a rousing rendition by the delegates of Rule Britannia, Jerusalem and the National Anthem accompanied by the magnificent organ in the Central Methodist Hall played by **Cllr David Meacock**, the conference came to an end. Those present had heard magnificent speeches, excellent policy and a great keenness to get on with the job of leaving the EU and restoring the UK with massive doses of commonsense!

Much more locally and sadly in brief are the reports from some of the events that have been held in Dorset in September. The **Dorset County Show** near Dorchester enjoyed reasonable weather and many of the 40,000+ visitors saw the stand and a fairly continuous flow chat to many UKIP volunteers from various Dorset associations. Organised by the Dorset West association and mostly funded by a large donation from a keen and generous member many leaflets, booklets and DVDs were distributed. Organisers were happy with the response and the hope is that it translates into new members and UKIP voters.

At the **Parley** meeting in September over 110 people, with around 70 – 80 being non-members, heard three speakers, Robin Grey the Christchurch PPC, Rollo Reid the Christchurch chairman and Ian Smith the County Councillor for Ferndown explain the link between the proposed large scale building on greenbelt in Parley and the EU – it is EU policy as is the Core Strategy.

Over 80 crowded into the Liston Hotel to hear the **Diane James** speak with great authority, clarity and modesty on many subjects including her experiences and major success for UKIP at the Eastleigh by-election last February. She also answered numerous questions fully, showing great skill, tack and knowledge. What an asset Mrs James is to UKIP – our first UKIP lady Prime Minister? The Christchurch PPC **Robin Grey** also spoke well and informed all present of a new UKIP shop for which he had just signed the lease. Situated in Bargates, Christchurch this would open soon and he hoped for volunteers from all local branches to man it for as many hours a week as possible. No doubt Robin will be in Diane James' Cabinet in due course!
