Sorry to nag – but! We still need more members to stand in the **County Council Elections** in June. We currently have three potential candidates but need a further dozen. If necessary we can help you with your forms.



Would any more of our District Council candidates from 2007 like to give it another go? No more work involved than last time. Currently we have no one north of Wimborne! The list of wards is: Hambledon [1]: Stour Vale [1]: Shaftesbury [1]: Blandford [1]: Winterborne [1] Gillingham [1]: Cranborne Chase [1] Blackmore Vale [1]: Ferndown [2]: Verwood & 3 Legged Cross [2]: Minster [1]: Colehill & Stapehill [1]: West Moors & Holt [1]. Take your pick!!! So, who is going to volunteer? Are

you ready to do your bit for the independence of your country? Those who stood in the District Council elections in 2007 enjoyed the experience, and many said they wished in retrospect that they had been a bit more proactive in their 'campaigns'. You are unlikely to be elected [but who knows?], but that is not the point. We must provide every opportunity for the electorate to vote for us and to see us on their voting cards. We have not and will not go away. If you want to be elected, after all it is paid employment, start canvassing now. Candidates and assenters must be on the Electoral Roll and candidates be members of UKIP, with the assenters living in the division. [JLB can help with this]

On the subject of elections – now is the time to consider whether you are going to be away on June 4th or whether you are unable to get to your voting station. In either case you will need to register if you have not already done so. A **proxy** vote enables someone else to vote for you. A **postal** vote lets you vote before you go away. An elector acting as your Proxy can vote on behalf of a maximum of two persons unless they are related to you, in which case there is no limit to the number of proxy votes they can place. You must be able to give a good reason for applying for a proxy vote [e.g. on holiday or infirm etc]. You can apply for either online at http://www.direct.gov.uk and follow the link to 'government, citizens and rights' then 'Register to vote', x2 then in the 'How to vote' box select either Proxy or Postal. Otherwise contact your local council at Norden, Blandford Forum [North Dorset] or Furzehill, Wimborne [East Dorset]. Do it now!!!

It is time for our **Annual General Meeting**. This year there will be something different about it. We are holding it jointly with the Bournemouth West branch. To be held at the excellent Pimperne Village Hall on Saturday 28th March 09. Guest speaker will be Gawain Towler, so those of you who missed him at the February First Thursday will have the opportunity to hear, see and question your PPC and MEP list candidate. His knowledge is almost unrivalled within UKIP and we are extremely lucky to have him as our candidate. Time also to consider helping your branch by standing for the committee. It should be noted that two of the current

THE CROWN A Point of Interest: The Crown Estate made a profit of £211m last year. Concurrently the Queen's Treasurer made an appeal for an extra £4m for urgent repairs to Buckingham Palace. Bizarre? What is rarely reported is that the Queen receives not a penny from profits on the Crown Estate, which go directly into Gordon Brown's Treasury. AH!

The Bournemouth Echo recently carried a story that the Crown Estates are applying for the necessary permissions for a huge **Wind Farm** south of a line between Old Harry Rocks and the Needles. Originally planned for Lyme Bay, the proposals, which are said to be at an advanced state, are for 100 giant turbines about 10 miles south of the coastline costing £175m. Unfortunately the local councils of Bournemouth, Christchurch, Poole and Purbecks are unhappy at not been consulted.

Those of you in the private sector, and are wondering how to get by in these difficult times might like to know that a quarter of your Council Tax is used to subsidise the **pensions** of local authority workers. The bill has risen by 8% over the year to a total of £5b. This information comes from the Department for Communities and Local Government. Public sector workers still enjoy final salary schemes whilst the private sector has now closed them to new staff.

Former UKIP, now independent, southeast MEP Ashley Mote has lodged an **appeal** with the Criminal Cases Review Commission. A new legal team has examined the case and concluded that his convictions for fraud are unsafe. More details on his Website www.ashleymote.co.uk . We wish him every success.

The recession is blamed for the planned cut in **Police jobs** at a time when crime is likely to surge because of it. Dorset is expected to loose 50 officers in a reduction said to be 'significant and painful' and amounting to thousands nationwide. The sceptical amongst us might say that the traditional force is being purposely reduced so the government can 'genuinely' call upon the Eurogendarmerie and Europol to fill the gaps.

Lord Ahmed has received his comeuppance! The Labour [now ex-Labour] Lord has been convicted of dangerous driving by way of sending lengthy texts whilst driving on the M1, minutes before ploughing into a stationery vehicle killing the driver. He is expected to serve just 6 weeks of his 12 weeks sentence. Lord Ahmed recently threatened to get 10,000 Muslim protesters to demonstrate outside the House of Lords when UKIP Lord Pearson of Rannoch was due to host the Dutch MP Gert Wilders at a showing of his film 'Fitna' there. The film attempts to show how the Koran is being used by extremists to justify violence such as the 9/11 atrocity. Mr. Wilders was denied entry to the UK by our weak Home Secretary in an obvious case of appeasement of militants hostile to the UK. Some commentators have argued that this threat confirms what Mr Wilders maintains in his film. 'Fitna' is available for anyone to see on YouTube. Beware of other 'versions'.

France and Italy have signed an agreement on the development of nuclear energy that will result in Italy building nuclear power stations for the first time ever. Maybe the UK should join with them to avoid the construction of a plethora of wind turbines that are forecast for the UK.

The **German courts** are still considering whether, after the ratification of the Treaty Lisbon, German law would be subservient to Eu law. The eight judges are due to report in May or June. However it is thought that the German government will find a way to ratify the treaty regardless of the outcome, paving the way for the remaining states within the Eu to ratify it and thus bringing it into force across the Eu.

As we haven't brought you a piece from Gawain this month [after the last First-Thursday we don't want too much of a good thing!] and spurred on by John Myers' quotes from Thomas Jefferson we show a few examples of his wisdom and foresight [T.J's, not J.M's or G.T's although the latter two are no doubt just as talented!]:

- Experience hath shewn, that even under the best forms of government those entrusted with power have, in time, and by slow operations, perverted it into tyranny.
- ❖ How much pain they have cost us, the evils which have never happened.
- ❖ I do not take a single newspaper, nor read one a month, and I feel myself infinitely the happier for it.
- ❖ *Information is the currency of democracy.*
- ❖ It is incumbent on every generation to pay its own debts as it goes. A principle which if acted on would save one-half the wars of the world.
- ❖ It takes time to persuade men to do even what is for their own good. [Standing in County Council elections and taking positions on the committee?!! Ed]
- Liberty is to the collective body, what health is to every individual body. Without health no pleasure can be tasted by man; without liberty, no happiness can be enjoyed by society.
- ❖ My reading of history convinces me that most bad government results from too much government.
- Our country is now taking so steady a course as to show by what road it will pass to destruction, to wit: by consolidation of power first, and then corruption, its necessary consequence.

Whilst on the subject of reminders – If you have a plastic **Drivers Licence** be aware that it only lasts for 10 yrs. The date is given on it. Fines for not surrendering or renewing it are up to £1,000.00. Take care!

What the papers say:

- In an interview with *Le Monde* about France's reintegration into **NATO**, French Defence Minister Hervé Morin says, "The construction of a European defence is our ambition... With this step, we wish to Europeanise NATO." He also indicates that there will be no referendum in France on rejoining NATO, and rules out sending more troops to Afghanistan for the moment.
- According to ANP, Dutch retailers have protested to their government against EU import duties, saying that "in the name of antidumping, the crisis and saving jobs, one duty after another is being installed. Especially China is being targeted, but also products from Australia and the US are being made unnecessarily expensive", adding that "the consumer pays a higher price".
- In a letter to the *Times*, former Commonwealth Deputy Secretary-General Sir Peter Marshall argues that "Like the rejected constitutional treaty that it so closely resembles, the straitjacket **Lisbon Treaty** has become part of the problem rather than part of the solution, a sobering truth that would by now have been accepted by bodies less self-absorbed, and less seemingly deaf to constructive questioning of prevailing orthodoxies, than the institutions of the European Union."
- The FT reports that German business confidence has fallen to its lowest level for at least 18 years after a decline in industrial orders late last year. FT Deutschland notes that German politicians are "desperate". Meanwhile, the Telegraph reports that the cost of bankruptcy protection on German debt has reached an all-time high as a result of spill-over from the financial crisis in eastern Europe and mounting concerns about the stability of Germany's banking system. Hans Redeker, Currency Chief at BNP Paribas, is quoted saying: "the markets have started to price in a de facto bail-out of Eastern Europe and they think that Germany will have to pay the bill." [Nice to know we are not alone with our troubles could not happen to a nicer ally. Ed]
- The European Ombudsman has upheld a complaint by Scottish fishermen against the European Commission for an administrative error that reduced the number of days they could spend at sea. The mistake was included in a 2007 Council ruling that reduced the west of Scotland allocation from 280 to 250 days according to the BBC. European Voice reports that the Commission "immediately denied" any error had taken place, and it has until April to respond.
